Our aim at Janvrin School is to provide high quality teaching for all. We aim to do this by ensuring that teachers and teaching assistants are highly skilled through training and mentoring and that staff are effectively deployed throughout the school to meet the needs of the children.

We aim to close the gap between JP and non-JP pupils and provide targeted early intervention for underperforming pupils. All pupils are increasingly involved in their learning, setting of targets and responding to marking and feedback. Support of children through family and extended context work continues to secure long-term gains in outcomes for children.

### Teaching projects

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To develop resources to support on-line and remote learning for all children from Years 2-6, including home study and self-study projects. To ensure that all children, regardless of economic background, are able to access the same resources and opportunities.</p> <p>Activity: To purchase laptops for each child with a secure shared ownership agreement between parents and school, which ensures that children have full and unique access to a reliable laptop device provided by school. The laptop will be provisioned to ensure access to Google Classroom and year group specific activities throughout the year.</p> <p>Cost: £76,000</p>	<p>All children will have equal access to their learning and opportunities to make progress. Children will be able to access a wider range of resources across the school. Children will be better prepared for education and the wider world outside of Janvrin school as they develop their IT skills.</p>

## Targeted academic interventions

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To ensure on-going, direct professional development through coaching of staff by trained and experienced teachers. By doing this to ensure the highest quality delivery of teaching and learning for all children across the school.</p> <p>Activity: The school has invested in 2 teachers completing the outstanding teacher training (incorporating the Power of Coaching training). Through this to ensure the school has 2 teachers who have the capacity to work alongside colleagues in class on a systematic basis targeting key areas of professional development, for sustained periods of time.</p> <p>Cost: £77,000</p>	<p>Children will benefit from high quality teaching and learning at Janvrin school and this will support them in making expected progress against age related expectations.</p>

## Wider Strategies

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
<p>Aim: To provide children (and parents) with timely interventions and support against pastoral and mental health issues which have increased in profile since the pandemic started. This includes Nurture Group interventions, well-being and mental health support strategies, parenting support. This will ensure that children are able to access their learning and social development as effectively as possible both on a short- and long-term basis.</p> <p>Activity: To assess and clarify children who will access the Nurture group and sustained teaching and support of children in these facilities. 2x ELSA TA's supporting children on timetabled basis throughout each term; social support intervention strategies (especially for lunchtimes) for targeted groups of children for set periods of time. Triple-P and Theraplay support for parents where support needs have been identified.</p> <p>Cost: £30,000</p>	<p>Children will be able to communicate about mental health issues and explore their emotional wellbeing in order that they are ready to learn and access the curriculum.</p> <p>Children and parents of the school will understand that mental health issues are recognised, explored and supported at Janvrin School.</p>
