Our aim at Janvrin School this year is to continue to align levels of achievement in reading, writing and maths between JP and non-JP children both within the school and in comparison to all Island's school averages. In past years we have committed funding to provide additional teaching and tutoring to targeted pupils and year groups, and this strategy is now centrally supported and budgeted by CYPES allowing us to allocate funding in different areas.

It is clear from our data that, as children progress through the school, Janvrin JP children achieve higher than Island averages and reflect on-going progress towards higher levels of achievement for D and S assessments. In some areas of the curriculum, JP children achieve higher than non-JP children, especially in writing. This means that we need to continue to embed successful strategies as well as develop our focus on mental health support, wellbeing, punctuality and attendance and family support.

The school is also committed to providing greater capacity for teaching and support staffing roles throughout the school in order to provide consistency and continuity in children's school experiences and learning. This includes coaching and mentoring staff throughout the year by senior leaders.

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
Aim: To ensure on-going, direct professional development through coaching of staff by trained and experienced teachers. By doing this to ensure the highest quality delivery of teaching and learning for all children across the school.	Children will benefit from high quality teaching and learning at Janvrin school and this will support them in making expected progress against age related expectations.
Activity: The school has invested in 2 teachers completing the outstanding teacher training (incorporating the Power of Coaching training).	
Through this to ensure the school has 2 teachers who have the capacity to work alongside colleagues in class on a systematic basis targeting key areas of professional development, for sustained periods of time.	
Cost: £77,000	
Aim: to provide children within KS1 with intensive reading support and teaching on a daily basis through Reading Recovery, to ensure that their progress is accelerated towards average age expectations (PM Benchmark Lv. 17) by the end of Year 2.	That targeted children will make accelerated progress towards PM Benchmark Lv.17 and sustain this progress as they move towards KS2. From this children will develop greater confidence and self-esteem about their own abilities and will transfer this to other areas of their learning with improved outcomes across the curriculum.
Activity: to have a teacher from within our current staffing to be trained for RR and to deliver this to at	

least 4 children a day on a daily basis.

Project and Rationale	Expected Outcome
Aim: To provide children (and parents) with timely interventions and support against well-being and mental health issues across the school. This includes Nurture Group interventions, ELSA support and strategies, Decider Skill groups; Zones of regulation groups; LEGO groups; music therapy well-being and mental health support strategies, parenting support, and intensive 1-1 teaching. This will ensure that children are able to access their learning and social development as effectively as possible by developing self-regulation strategies and an openness to support. By doing this to increase the child's well-being and self-esteem and access to classroom learning and Inclusion.	Children will be able to communicate about mental health issues and explore their emotional wellbeing in order that they are ready to learn and access the curriculum. Children and parents of the school will understand that mental health issues are recognised, explored and supported at Janvrin School. Increased regulation will result in children being able to access their classroom learning more effectively and consistently.
Activity: To assess and clarify children who will access the Nurture group and sustained teaching and support of children in these facilities. 2x ELSA TA's supporting children on timetabled basis throughout each term; social support intervention strategies (especially for lunchtimes) for targeted groups of children for set periods of time. Triple-P and Theraplay support for parents where support needs have been identified. Cost: £100,000	

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
