Core Principles of Teaching and Learning

Inclusive Practice

- Teaching is adaptive and responsive to the diverse needs of learners.
- Barriers to learning are identified and addressed through high-quality differentiation and support.
- All staff are committed to equity, ensuring every child feels seen, heard, and valued.

Oracy-Rich Classrooms

- Oracy is embedded across the curriculum using Voice 21's framework.
- Pupils are taught to speak, listen, and communicate effectively in a range of contexts.
- Talk is used as a tool for learning, deepening understanding, and building confidence.

High Expectations and Ambition

- Teachers set ambitious goals for all pupils, regardless of background or starting point.
- Learning is scaffolded to ensure access and challenge for every child.

Formative Assessment and Feedback

- Teachers use ongoing assessment to inform planning and respond to pupil needs.
- Feedback is timely, specific, and focused on moving learning forward.

Teaching Strategies and Approaches

Clear Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

- Lessons begin with clear objectives and shared criteria for success.
- Pupils understand what they are learning and why it matters.

Modelling and Explicit Instruction

- Teachers model thinking, language, and processes to make learning visible.
- New concepts are broken down and taught in manageable steps.

Deliberate Practice and Retrieval

- Pupils revisit and apply learning regularly to strengthen memory and understanding.
- Retrieval practice is used to consolidate knowledge over time.

Collaborative Learning and Dialogue

- Pupils engage in structured talk, group work, and peer learning.
- Talk partners, dialogic teaching, and exploratory talk are used to deepen thinking.

Supporting Vulnerable Learners

SEND

- Individual needs are met through personalised strategies and inclusive classroom practice.
- RONS and support plans are used effectively to guide provision.

MLL

- Language development is supported through visual aids, scaffolding, and structured talk.
- Oracy strategies are used to build vocabulary and confidence.

Jersey Premium

- Teaching is designed to close gaps in attainment and opportunity.
- Staff use evidence-informed strategies to support engagement and progress.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- Teaching and learning are regularly reviewed through lesson visits, pupil voice, book looks, and data analysis.
- CPD is aligned with school priorities, including inclusive practice and Oracy development.
- Staff collaborate to share best practice and reflect on impact.

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it reflects current research, school priorities, and the needs of our learners.
